Communication & Language:

Listen and respond to a simple instruction.

To be able to ask and answer simple questions.

Start to develop conversation, often jumping from topic to topic. To talk using full sentences.

Can start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.

Listen to simple stories and understand what is happening, with the help of the pictures.

Literacy:

To recognise and name features of a book – text direction, words, illustrations, cover, title

Pay attention and respond to the pictures or the words.

To recognise and begin to trace own name.

To match sounds and identify initial sounds in words.

Physical Development:

Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks

To choose right resources top carry out their own plan
To collaborate with others to manage large items
To use a comfortable grip with good control when mark
making

To use one handed tools and equipment To be able to put own coat and shoes on

Understanding the World:

To continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.

To be able to talk about own family and traditions.

To notice changes in materials when they are cooked.

To use senses to explore and talk about their observations.

During this topic we will focus on different celebrations. We will talk about the importance of Birthdays, Diwali and Christmas and how different people choose to celebrate. We will also talk about Bonfire Night and link this to fireworks used during celebrations.
