







Daily Routines...



8.45-8:55am – Gates into the Reception garden will open from the front playground, an adult will stand at the gate to welcome children into school. Parents to wait outside the gates as children walk into the classroom.

When your child comes into school in the morning, they will need to:

- hang their coat on their peg
- put their water bottle in the water bottle tray
- put their book bag into their red tray
- order their lunch in class with support from staff (menus sent home in advance)

11.50am – Lunchtime

At lunchtime, the Reception Class support staff and the lunchtime controllers will look after the children. They will wash their hands, go to the toilet and be taken to the hall by the class teacher. After they have eaten their lunch, they will play outside until it is time to start the afternoon at 1.00pm.

3.15pm – Children dismissed and handed over from Reception garden area gate. Children who are attending After School Club will be taken by a member of staff.





Our topics this year...



Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA)



- RBA is run by our school teachers on a 1:1 with each child low threat, not 'test conditions', takes approximately 20 minutes to complete
- Activity based observation



- Designed to be an inclusive assessment, accessible to the majority of pupils on entry to school. It has been designed so that pupils with SEND and those learning English as an Additional Language (EAL) can participate in the standard assessment format and has been subject to a SEND and cultural review.
- School does not get a numerical score of how the child 'achieved' as baseline is used as a progress measure against later formal assessments at the end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6) to measure the overall progress in their primary school journey.
- Our Reception staff's daily professional assessment still remains the most powerful way your child will be supported to make progress.
- There is no need to help your child to prepare for the assessment. Your child should not even be aware that they are being assessed. Continue to support your child's learning at home in the usual way.





School Lunches

Under the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative, school lunches are free for all children until the end of Year 2. All reception children will be served a hot school lunch at Alder Grove.

Milk

Daily milk is free for Under 5s and if you wish your child to continue to have daily milk once they turn 5, it costs approximately £14 per term.

Extra-curricular Activities

The school has a wide and varied extra-curriculum timetable. However, to allow children to settle into the Reception class, these will not start until the Spring Term at the earliest.




Payments

Currently, the school has an online payment system called ScoPay, to allow parents to make all transactions through one system.

School Uniform

- Uniform list and policy is on the school website.
- All uniform can be ordered from our suppliers Smart Impressions.
- Website link can be found on Uniform section on the website
- Please label **all** uniform and equipment your child brings into school.
- Wearing of jewellery is not permitted, unless it is for religious or medical reasons.





ΡΕ

- Children come into school on their PE day wearing their PE kit.
- Warm weather navy blue shorts, school polo shirt & trainers
- Cooler weather navy blue jogging bottoms/leggings, school polo shirt, school jumper & trainers

Equipment

- Children will need their book bags each day with their reading books, reading journal and library book.
- Water bottle each day (with only water inside).
- PE kit to be worn on their PE day.
- Pair of wellies ideally to stay at school.
- Weather appropriate clothing rain or winter coat, sun hat as children will access outdoor areas in all conditions.





Absence and lateness

- If your child is unwell and cannot attend school, please phone the school by 9.15am on the first and any subsequent days of their illness and give the reason for your child's absence.
- If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea you must keep your child at home for 48 hours after the last bout.
- Please ensure that your child arrives punctually and prepared for school. However, if you are running late, please take your child to the main office from 8.55am onwards. A member of the office team will take a lunch order and take them safely to their classroom.
- Holidays should not be taken during term time and will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Medication

- If your child requires regular medication, a care plan will be created with the school, parents and any medical professionals required.
- For prescription medication, a medical form from the office or website will need to be completed and taken to the office before any medication is administered.
- The school will conduct regular checks, but it the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure medication kept in school is in date.

Covid-19 - School Procedures


Summer Term 2022

At Alder Grove, we will now be managing Covid-19 alongside other infectious illnesses. We know that children can often become unwell and pick up bugs and illnesses. Your continued help in preventing the spread of illness in school is essential. The following advice has been given to schools by Wokingham Borough Council.

The official list of Covid-19 symptoms has been expanded to reflect the wider signs of Covid-19 and to align with symptoms of flu and other common respiratory infections. This includes:

A high temperature or shivering (chills)

A new, continuous cough



Shortness of breath

Feeling tired or exhausted

An aching body

A headache




A blocked or runny nose

Loss of appetite

A sore throat

Diarrhoea

Feeling sick or being sick



Your child should not attend school and avoid contact with other people for at least 3 days if they have symptoms of Covid-19 and they either:

Do not feel well enough to go to school or do their normal activities

- Children can return to school when they feel better or do not have a high temperature.
- If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, and they feel well enough, they can attend school.
- Most children who are unwell will recover in a few days with rest and plenty of fluids.


