

Maths - Addition and Subtraction and



Shape

- To recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts to 100.
- To add and subtract numbers to 100 using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally.
- To solve problems with addition and subtraction, including recognition of the inverse relationship between the two.
- To name some common 2D and 3D shapes and be able to describe their properties (number of sides, vertices, edges and lines of symmetry).
- To describe similarities and differences between different 2D and 3D shapes.























PE: Fundamentals and Gymnastics (Indoor)

- To explore how the body moves differently when running at different speeds, and to develop changing direction and dodging.
- To develop balance, stability and landing safely.
- To be able to perform gymnastic shapes to create balances and link them together.
- To demonstrate co-ordination and different take offs and landings when performing jumps.
- To be able to link travelling actions and balances using apparatus.
- To develop rolling and sequence building.
- To develop sequence work on apparatus.

PE: Target Games (Outdoor)

- To develop an understanding of target games and how much power to apply when aiming at a target.
- To understand how to score in different target games using overarm throwing.
- To develop understanding of different target games using the skill of kicking.
- To develop striking to a target
- To develop hitting a moving target,
- To select an appropriate skill to play a game.

Art: Art and Design Skills

We will be learning and developing artistic skills across a range of media in the following ways:



- To explore the use of tones in shading when working as an artist (Nancy McCroskey study).
- To use our hands as a tool for making (clay).
- To learn to weave.
- To develop our painting skills.
- To apply our painting skills when working as an artist (Clarice Cliff study).
- To experience drawing for pleasure.
