All of the children will be transitioning from the RWINC writing programme to formal English lessons. We will be using the following texts and to write a range of text types and genres.

- Journey by Aaron Becker
- A Planet full of Plastic by Neal Layton
- Clean Up! by Nathan Bryon

In our writing this half term we will be focusing on forming our letters correctly, punctuating sentences, using sounds to spell unfamiliar words, using expanded noun phrases, using the present tense and extending our sentences with conjunctions. We will also be starting to learn how to proof read and edit our writing.

Master Reading and Spelling

When children complete the RWINC programme, they will be transitioning to Master Reading. In these lessons children will be developing their comprehension skills. They will also move to the RWINC Spelling programme, to learn different Spelling rules.

We will be continuing to practise a cursive, joined handwriting style in writing across the curriculum,

Maths: Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication

and Division

- To add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally including a two-digit number and 1s, a two-digit number and 10s, 2 two-digit numbers and 3 one-digit numbers.
- To recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables including recognising odd and even numbers.
- To calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication, division and equals signs.
- To know that multiplication of 2 numbers can be done in any order and division of 1 number by another cannot.
- To solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods and known multiplication and division facts.

Mastering Number

- explore how the numbers 6 to 9 can be doubled using the '5 and a bit' and '10 and a bit' structure
- use doubles to calculate near doubles
- use bonds of 10 to reason about bonds of 20, in which the given addend is greater than 10

PE: Reading coaches (Indoor)

This half term we will be taught by the Reading coaches for one lesson a week. They will be teaching us a range of skills for both indoor and outdoor sports.


PE: Sending and receiving (Outdoor)
