English

We will be using the following texts in English this half term to write a persuasive piece,:

Our focus for this half term will be on using more advanced punctuation such as possessive apostrophes and speech marks. We will start looking at dictionaries and thesauruses to check definitions and improve our vocabulary. Similar to Autumn I we will practice editing our writing and think of ways that we can improve. We are also starting our Year 3 spelling rules/patterns; beginning with prefixes.

Please continue to practise the common exception words this half term at home in cursive writing.

Master Reading

We will be reading The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark by We will learn how to accurately answer comprehension questions including inference questions (using clues in the text to justify our answers) and we will explain the meaning of new vocabulary so we can confidently use it ourselves.

Please continue to read the Accelerated Reader books and do the quizzes. We will monitor this weekly. Library day is Tuesday.

Science: Animals including humans

We will learn about food groups and a balanced diet. The children will learn the effects protein, carbohydrates and vitamins have on the body.

We will look at vertebrates and invertebrates. Following on from this we will closely look at the human skeleton and how muscles work to move our bodies.

We will also practise working scientifically to test a hypothesis.

Maths: Addition and Subtraction,
